

 - Ensure that the real-time project is on the right track
 - Consolidate the IGS approach to the new GNSS developments (Galileo, GPS modernisation, Glonass revitalisation)





Recent IGS Developments (1)

- New Terms of References, March 2005:
 - Change of name to International GNSS Service (IGS)
 - Executive Committee
 - Board representation
 - Updated policies for AC's, DC's, WG's,PP's
- Formal launch of the Global Geodetic Observing System GGOS by the IAG, August 2005





Recent IGS Developments (2)

- Interesting developments with respect to Galileo/IGS interactions:
 - Two full day meetings between Galileo
 System Engineering Manager and his team and the IGS GNSS WG at ESOC
 - Participation of several IGS AC's and IERS in Galileo Geodetic Service Provider Prototype
 - Deployment of Galileo receivers at IGS sites for GSTB-V2



Recent IGS Developments (3)

- IAG a full member of the International Committee on GNSS (ICG), established under the auspices of the UN Office for Outer Space Affairs, December 2005
- Encouraging progress with AFREF project
- New IGS Global Data Centre in Korea (KASI)
- Expanding collaboration with China (Chinese National Earthquake Centre, Beijing; Wuhan University)
